A solo exhibition by Ruth McDermott of textile and lighting related work, celebrating the dramatic yet fragile Icelandic landscape, experienced as part of an arts residency. She was particularly inspired by the Mýrdalsjökull glacier – an ice cap which sits on the Katla volcano in southern Iceland creating a land of contrasts between pure white ice and jet black volcano dust. However, like all glaciers the world over, Mýrdalsjökull is in retreat and in a few years will exist in memory only.
